

Schools - Rise.

LOUDOUN COUNTY, VIRGINIA.

In obedience to the requirements of the new Revenue Law, approved April 16, 1903, I send you the following memorandum of the boundary lines of school districts in Loudoun County:

Leesburg District

Beginning at a point on the Potomac River at the side of the old ferry house nearly opposite the Point of Rocks, thence with the top of the Catoctin Mountains to Clark's Gap, thence with the south west side of the County Road to George Rhodes', thence with the top of the Hogback Mountains to Goose Creek, thence with said Creek to its mouth, thence with the Potomac River to the beginning.

Broad Run District

Beginning at the mouth of Goose Creek, thence with said Creek to Evergreen Mills, thence with the top of the Negro Mountains and west side of the County road to the Prince William line at the J. S. Oren farm, thence with Bull Run to the Fairfax line, thence with said river to the beginning.

Mercer District

Beginning at Evergreen Mills, thence with Goose Creek to the mouth of Beaver Dam, thence with said Beaver Dam to the south side of the County road leading from Philomont to Unison, thence with said road on the south side thereof to the forks south of J. Whitacre's, thence with the north east side of the County road to Beaver Dam, thence with the south fork of Beaver Dam and to the top of the Blue Ridge at the Clarke line, thence with the Clarke and Loudoun line to the Fauquier line, thence with the Fauquier and Loudoun line to the Prince William line, thence with the said Prince William line to the south west corner of Broad Run Township, thence with the west

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Loudoun and Jefferson County lines to the Potomac River, thence with said River to the northwestern corner of the Township of Leesburg, thence with the top of the Catoctin mountains to the beginning.

The Town of Leesburg School District

Beginning with the farm of H. J. Fadeley, where it joins the lands of C. A. Elmore, thence with said outer boundary thereof to the outer lines of the lands of George T. Metzger, George W. Survick, Mistress Joseph Rhodes, J. W. Foster, Mistress J. F. Bowles, J. P. Brinton, R. T. Hempstone, Charles P. Janney, the home place of the late T. W. Edward's estate, Henry Schulke, Wallace George, Mistress Horatio Trundle, Mistress R. A. Paxton, E. B. Harrison, Henry Harrison (Ball's Bluff Place), the lands of John Thomas's estate, Doctor C. S. Carter, Emil Schulke, C. A. Elmore, to the said H. J. Fadeley's land, the beginning, and any other tracts omitted to be mentioned necessary to constitute a continuous outer boundary of said school district.

mt. Gilead District

Beginning at Clark's Gap, thence with the south west side of the County road to Geo. Rhodes', thence with the top of the Hogback mountains to Goose Creek, thence with said Creek to the mouth of Beaver Dam, thence with Beaver Dam to the County road leading from Philomont to Unison, thence with said road on the south side thereof to the forks south of J. Whitacre's, thence with the north east side of the County road to Beaver Dam, thence with the south fork of Beaver Dam and to the top of the Blue Ridge at the Clarke line, thence with the top of the Blue Ridge to a point west of the north west corner of Craven James' farm, thence with the northern boundary of said farm to the Scotland road, thence with the south side of said road to the Leesburg and Snickers' Gap turnpike at Mahlon Thomas', thence with the south side of said Turnpike to the corner of J. D. Dillon's and Annie Dillon's land in J. F. Hampton's line, and instead of running thence East with said turnpike, that a new line of division run with the corporate limits of Purcellville North across said Hampton to a maple tree near the Hillsboro road and near the entrance to J. F. Hampton's farm, thence across J. V. Nichols' land to South east corner of culvert in road between said Nichols and W. G. Birdsall; thence across said Birdsall's land to a point on North limit of Southern Railway's right of way seventy five feet northeast from east abutment of railroad bridge near said Birdsall's house; thence across said Railroad's right of way and the lands of Lanie Gregg and mistress A. P. Love to a point two hundred and fifty feet north of centre of turnpike and in line with a line two hundred and fifty feet east of and parallel to centre of new road along said Love's west line, thence across said Love's land

with said line two hundred and fifty feet east of ans parallel to centre of new road to centre of said turnpike, thence with the said turnpike to the beginning.

Jefferson District

Beginning at Clark's Gap, thence with the south side of *Corner of Villars' land & with Mt Gilead line as above described & to* the Leesburg and Snickers' Gap Turnpike to the top of the Catoctin mountains, thence with the top of said mountains to the Limestone road on the lands of Wm. H. Cassidy, thence westwardly to the point of intersection of the Morrisonville road with the Loudoun and Berlin Turnpike near Hamilton's mill, thence with the south side of said Morrisonville road to Morrisonville, thence with the road dividing the lands of John Leslie and I. Morrison's heirs to the west end of said road at the corner of the lands of Job. Smith and Michael Hunter, thence a straight line to Dawson's Gap in the Short hill, thence with the road running north west to a large rock marked D. P. corner of Cocke's original patent, thence with said patent line between the lands of Edward Harding and William Smallwood to the Hillsboro and Harpers ferry grade, thence with a road between E. Chamblin and H. Wince past P. Derry's to Keye's Gap at the top of the Blue Ridge, thence with the top of said mountain to the north west corner of the Township of Mount Gilead, thence with its northern boundary (of Mount Gilead) to the beginning.

Lovettsville District

Beginning at the top of the Catoctin Mountains at the intersection of the Limestone road on the lands of Wm. H. Cassidy, being the north east corner of Jefferson Township above described, thence with the northern boundary of Jefferson District to the top of the Blue Ridge, thence with the
