Report of the Superintendent of Schools to the Board of Schools of the Board of School Commispiones of the County, and to the Superintendent of the Situacy There.

The Superintendent of Schools of the Country of Loudown herewith submits to the Board of School Commissioners of soid Country, his account of receipts and disburrements for the year ending the 30th of Suptember 1847. Thom this account it will appear that during the year he has received officially the sum of \$191.97 on account of the balance unexpended at the last arrival statisticant, and \$1307.48, for the School quota of the year 1847; that he has hair out for tuition and other authorised escheuses the sum of \$1318.93, and that there is a balance now in his heads of \$180.52, unexpended.

It will further appear by the abstract that 545 children, extered by The district Commissioners, attended school during the year the aggregate number of 30,643 days, at an exchange of \$1225.72 - that the aurage attendance of each child was 565 days, at the arrange expense of \$2.27 and that there are accounts set due and outstanding to an amount which your Superintendent is unable to ascertain, but sufficient, as is believed, to cover the abovementioned balance in his hands.

The same document shows the aggregate number of insignt children in the leventy, as reported to the Superintendent by the several Commissioners to be 871.

withe the sanction of the Board on entering whom the duties of the office, your superintendent fixed the teachers compensation for each pupils at four cents, and having ascertained the net amount of the fund applicable to the education the poor as man as he could, apprised each commissioner of his equal proportion thereof.

Whenever are change is made in the mode of conducting any sistem submitted to the maniagement of a body of men, it is always attended with more or less tardings in getting such change into full and successful ofunction, and in this case the body of learning increased from fifteen to twenty three, a majority of whom are new members; it was therefore not until a late period in the scholastic year that your Superintendent could ascertain with any precision the proportion of each learning increase the tempore operate no regular account with the learn missioners rescheduly, but continued the olds form which he concerns to be substantially and in effect contracting the spirit, if not the letter, of the law, and no injustice, as he associous, has been down to the proor children, for they collectively received the full benefit of the ferrid.
