The second school, also a one-roomer, with a front porch and the date "1910" inscribed over the door, stood on a knoll about 1,000 feet west of the South Fork of Broad Run, on the south side of Evergreen Mills Road. It served until 1939, when it was torn down. The third school brick one-story, six-room Arcola School of 1939, now the community center. It was the only school in Loudoun to be built with federal funds from the Public Works Administration. It closed in 1975.
