Dear Sir;

I agree to furnish 300 copies of a map of Louden Co. Va., in accordance with Specifications.

One Base map tracing suitable for reproduction, from U. S. Postoffice map of Louden Co. Va., showing all roads drainage, and lettering thereon, together with added Incorporated Towns, to be shown on map by different style lettering. All School and Town locations as may be desired, to be shown by symbols. Mountains, Ridges and Hills, appearing on Taylor Map, to be shown on map by hachures. The six School Districts, to be shown in distinctive colors, pink, blue, yellow, green, buff, purple. The school district names in out line letters in black. Two rivers Potomac Riv. and Goose Cr. shown in blue. Legend to show explanatory color scheme. The size of map to be, paper size 36X36 in.

Quality of paper like enclosed sample attached hereto. All maps mounted on top and bottom rollers, (moulding 7/8 in. round 7/8 in.) attached thereon, tacked and taped. Maps delivered pre paid to Purcellville, Va. For the sum of \$540.00.

The settlement for said maps, to be made in two payments, \$250.00 on completion and approval of Base tracing, To the balance, \$290.00 to be paid on completion and approval of printing, roller mounting, maps completed and boxed.

Now, therefore, The condition of the foregoing obligation is such that if the said Principal shall well and truly indemnify and save harmless the said Obligee from any pecuniary loss resulting from the breach of any of the terms, covenants and conditions of the said contract on the part of the said Principal to be performed, then this obligation shall be void; otherwise to remain in full force and effect in law: PROVIDED, however, that this Bond is issued subject to the following conditions and provisions:

First.—That no liability shall attach to the Surety hereunder unless, in the event of any default on the part of the Principal in the performance of any of the terms, covenants or conditions of the said contract, the Obligee shall promptly, and in any event not later than thirty days after knowledge of such default, deliver to the Surety at its office in the City of Baltimore, written notice thereof with a statement of the principal facts showing such default and the date thereof; nor unless the said Obligee shall deliver written notice to the Surety at its office aforesaid, and the consent of the Surety thereto obtained, before making to the Principal the final payment provided for under the contract herein referred to.

Second.—That in case of such default on the part of the Principal, the Surety shall have the right, if it so desire, to assume and complete or procure the completion of said contract; and in case of such default, the Surety shall be subrogated and entitled to all the rights and properties of the Principal arising out of the said contract and otherwise, including all securities and indemnities theretofore received by the Obligee, and all deferred payments, retained percentages and credits, due to the Principal at the time of such default, or to become due thereafter by the terms and dates of the contract.

Third.—That in no event shall the Surety be liable for a greater sum than the penalty of this Bond, or subject to any suit, action or other proceeding thereon that is instituted later than the 23rd day of May A. D. 19 23.

Fourth.—That in no event shall the Surety be liable for any damage resulting from, or for the construction or repair of any work damaged or destroyed by an act of God, or the public enemies, or mobs, or riots, or civil commotion, or by employes leaving the work being done under said contract, on account of so-called "strikes" or labor difficulties.

Fifth.— (a.) That the Surety shall not be liable for damages for injuries to the person of anyone, under or by authority of any statutory provision for damages or compensation to any employe, or otherwise; and (b.) Shall not be obligated to furnish any bond or obligation other than the one executed.
