- 2. The salary of each principal will be determined by adding to the above schedule \$72 for each assistant and an additional \$72. Principals on a twelve months' basis will receive additionally the State Appropriation for school principals. Where assistant principals receive a supplement, deduct the supplement from the principal's salary.
- 3. Home Economics teachers will receive a salary determined by adding to the annual salary 4/5 of the salary for one month in all cases where service is for ten months.
- 4. Teachers whose certificates are "extended" for one year without meeting requirements for renewal will receive \$240 less than provided above.
- 5. Schools will be open 180 days, but teachers will be on duty 188 days including attendance at meetings.

However, the two boards feel that no steps should be taken in reference to construction of the proposed buildings and additions until and unless reasonable assurance shall have been given by the parents of colored children of the county that they will conform to our considerate opinion that their education can be promoted better by their continued school attendance on a segregated basis.
