# Route Seven Crash Draws TJ Fine

A young Douglass High School student, charged with "following too closely" in a Monday-morning before school accident which did \$260 in damage to the back of Arthur Godfrey's Cadillac, was fined \$14.25 in Trial Justice Court Wednesday by Trial Justice John Dudley.

Summerford B. Tillett, Jr., a Godfrey employee, was driving the Cadillac on Route 7 west of Leesburg at about 8:30 in the morning when the accident occurred. He slowed his speed as a Purcellville student at Loudoun County High School rapidly drove his car past the two vehicles to crash into a dump truck which was coming east on the highway. The truck was driven by Lawrence W. Gorham, Alexandria, who did not testify.

Tillett said he was "not conscious" of the car behind him, and slowed the Godfrey Cadillac from approximately 55 miles per hour to 25 to avoid the accident ahead.

According to Trooper G. W. Thomas, the 1950 Ford Sedan driven by the 19 year old student skidded 50 feet before striking the rear of the Godfrey car.

## License Suspended

A juvenile who drove over 75 miles per hour near Wheatland the morning of October 5 was fined \$24.25 in court by Judge Dudley, who said "such a speed almost asks for a severe penalty." His license was suspended for 60 days.
