and County and City Treasurers:

The following apportionment is at the rate of 25 cents per head of school
ion, and consists of the \$100,000 of the sale of the Atlantic, Mississippi and
Railroad, ordered to be applied to the arrearage due the public free schools by
entitled an act to return to the public free schools a *portion* of the money
therefrom, approved April 21st, 1882, and the accumulation from the amount
by the Auditor under the provisions of the law to pay to public free schools
money set apart by the Constitution, as by act approved March 6th, 1882. The
amounts amounting to \$139,166.25—less \$6,802.64, amount deducted on account of
balances reported on hand in the several counties.

Section 142, page 63, of School law provides that, "At the proper time each county superintendent of schools shall notify the county treasurer, in writing, that the State money apportioned to the county is ready for distribution, whereupon the county treasurer shall forthwith make requisition in due form upon the Second Auditor of the State for the amount specified; and as soon as the money has been received into the county treasury, it shall be the duty of the treasurer to inform the county superintendent, in writing, of the fact."

County treasurers will please observe the following form in drawing the warrants on the Second Auditor:

This money is to be used *exclusively* for the *pay of teachers*, and cannot be used for any other purpose.

Section 150, page 67, of School law, provides that "all sums of money derived from State funds which are unexpended in any year in any school district, shall go into the general school fund of the State for redivision the next year." Several counties report a balance of this fund on hand, and all such balances have been deducted from the amount apportioned to such counties.

A copy of this circular is sent to each county and city superintendent and to each county and city treasurer.
