CONSOLIDATION OF WHITE SCHOOLS

At a meeting of the County School Board on February 28, 1940 the following resolution was adopted:

"Be It Resolved: A. That the County School Board hereby adopts the following as its program of final consolidation of white schools to be effective as early as available space and road conditions will permit.

- 1. Close Cool Spring and transport to Leesburg.
- 2. Close Mountain Gap and transport to Leesburg, provided that the lower grades may be retained for a few years.
- 3. Close Mountville school and transport to Middleburg with bus timed to connect with high school bus to Aldie.
- 4. Close Philomont and transport pupils to Unison-Bloomfield.
- 5. Close Round Hill high school department and transport pupils to Lincoln
- 6. Re-route high and elementary school children from Edge Grove area to Round Hill and Lincoln.
- 7. Close Emerick and transport children to Hillsboro.
- 8. Re-route high school children from Emerick, Neersville, and Hillsboro to Lovettsville.
- 9. Close Taylorstown and transport children to Lovettsville.
- 10. Close Ashburn high school department and transport children to Leesburg.
- 11. Close Sterling and transport children to Ashburn.

Consolidation of White School (Con.)

12. Re-route high and elementary school children from near Coleman's school to Arcola and Aldie.

B. That the following are hereby designated

as permanent schools.

High Schools - Grade 8 to 11

Aldie, Leesburg, Lincoln and Lovettsville

Elementary Schools - Grades 1 to 7

Aldie, Arcola, Ashburn, Bluemont, Hamilton, Hillsboro, Leesburg, Lincoln, Lovettsville, Lucketts, Middleburg, Purcellville, Round Hill, Sunny Ridge, Unison-Bloomfield and Waterford. **

The School Board has decided to close only the Taylorstown school in 1940-41.

SPECIAL NOTES

Applications have been authorized by the school board for loans from the State Literary Fund as follows:

- 1. For 2-room addition at Lincoln \$10,000 2. For 4-room addition at Leesburg 28,000
- 3. For a negro high school at Leesburg 40,000

Advice from the State Department of Education is that no Literary Funds are now available, that applications for loans will not be approved until funds are available, that the delay is estimated at from 12 to 18 months, and that applications will eventually be considered in the order in which they are filed. Therefore no new building can be done in 1940-41.

Special notes(con)

The budget sets up for the first time a fund for sick leave for teeachers. This is \$800 for white and colored teachers in 1940-41.

The board proposes to pay colored teachers for 10 months at the 1939-40 scale and to make no change in the salary schedule for white teachers.

The board has under consideration the erection of shelters on bus routes and could have available about \$400 to \$500 under this budget.
