Application for Slater Fund Aid for County Training School

Application is hereby made to the Trustees of the John F. Slater Fund for an allotment of \$ 200.00 to be used in partial support of the Negro County Training School in Loudoun County, State of Virginia, during the school year 1932-1933, this school to be open without cost to any Negro high school pupils from any part of this County.
