State Board of Education Re-elects Supt. Edmondson.

After hearing the claims of all the candidates for the position of School Superintendent of Loudoun County on last Friday afternoon at Richmond, the State Board of Education went into executive session Saturday night and elected W. G. Edmondson to succeed himself. Mr. Edmondson was opposed by Mr. E. O. Russel and Mr. H. L. Keen, both of Loudoun County.

Mr. Westmoreland Davis, of Leesburg, appeared before the Board of Education and made a talk in behalf of Mr. Edmondson and urged his reappointment.

Those who sought to displace Mr. Edmondson made no charges against him but stated that he was not working in harmony with the wishes of the people of Loudoun County who did not look upon him as one of Loudoun's sons, and that such being the condition the best results could not be obtained under Mr. Edmondson's administration. A plea was made to the Board to give Loudoun County a Loudoun man as Superintendent inasmuch as there are capable men within the County's borders.

However, the Board of Education could see no material cause for the removal of the present incumbent and inasmuch as no charges were brought against Mr. Edmondson they re-elected him.
