Special schools will not be put down as such unless they are independent schools—that is unconnected with a college or university.
 5. Do not report any school with an enrollment of less than ten pupils.
 6. Indicate whether association or league is white or colored.
 7. Superintendents are expected to make this report complete and accurate.
