NOTABLE EVENTS OF THE YEAR:

1. In Building

Enlargement of Bluemont school. Cost \$1000
 Enlargement of Taylorstown. " \$2500
 Enlargement of Sterling. " 500
 Plans for erection of new building at Aldie. " \$7000.

2. In Sanitation

Medical inspection of all the schools of the county under the auspices of The Federated Society and State Health Department.

Plans for employment of County Nurse in execution.

Campaign for sanitary toilets in all the schools.

All school pupils vaccinated.

3. In Curriculum

Out-line of State Course of Study placed in the hands of all teachers. Page limits and suggestions given in out-line.

4. In Supervision

Plans to enlarge work of principals of consolidated and high schools by requiring one day of each week to be given by them to supervision of one and two room schools nearest to them. Monday being observed as holiday instead of Saturday by consolidated and high schools.

5. In Attendance

Honor Roll of teachers published each month in county papers and in monthly letter of division superintendent. Honor roll is based on percentage of attendance. Result- greatly increased attendance.

6. In Normal Progress of Children (The Question of Retardation)

A problem. No solution.

7. In Eradicating Juvenile Illiteracy

We plan to keep in touch with every child of school age in the county. Will begin by making a list as per 1915 census.

8. In Eradicating Adult Illiteracy

One to get to this problem soon.
