

NOTES AND EXPLANATION OF HEADINGS

TOTAL.—Under this heading include the sum of all figures in the columns to the right, these columns to contain no duplicates. The figures in Column 2 must be consistent with the figures in Tables 2, 4, 5, etc., but should also include salary paid Division Superintendent by State.

NORMAL SCHOOLS.—Include normal training high schools.
