Another parent whose daughter has graduated from the Loudoun County Training School high school course, is still within the school age but is unable to go to college, wants a home economics course for her daughter. This is being taught in the schools for white children but not in the schools which Negro children attend. I have advised this parent that she is entitled to have her daughter receive from you and the Board of Education a home economics course equal to that given the white children. As I stated before the Board of Education Tuesday March 12, 1940, I make no suggestion how this shall be done.) It would be presumptuous on my part to attempt to usurp your function as to how such course shall be given, (so long as you accord the Negro student the equal protection of the law. This matter will also come before you officials in the near future, and I raise the point in this letter in case you should wish to confer
