

SCHOOL FAIR AT LOUDOUN.

Addresses and Spelling Bees the Principal Features.

LEESBURG, Va., November 4, 1911.

The second annual school fair of Loudoun county was held at the town hall in Leesburg today. The morning session was held at the courthouse. An agricultural address was made by Joseph Wing on "Alfalfa," and there was an educational address by Prof. A. B. Chandler of the Fredericksburg Female Normal School and an address to the Boys' Corn Club by Westmoreland Davis.

At the same time an arithmetical contest was held at the Leesburg Academy.

At 1 o'clock the children, teachers and school officials, headed by a brass band, marched to the town hall for the afternoon exercises. Two of the features of the fair were the spelling bees conducted by Rev. Harry M. Moffett and Cecil Connor of Leesburg.

In a short address T. S. Settle, state supervisor of rural schools, awarded the school fair prizes, and the Corn Club prizes were presented by Howard M. Hoge, county demonstrator.
