OFFICE SUPERINTENDENT PUBLIC INSTRUCTION,  
RICHMOND, VA., Sept. 4th, 1884.

To County and City Superintendents,  
and County and City Treasurers:

The following apportionment is at the rate of 25 cents per head of school population, and consists of the \$100,000 of the sale of the Atlantic, Mississippi and Ohio Railroad, ordered to be applied to the arrearage due the public free schools by an act entitled an act to return to the public free schools a portion of the money diverted therefrom, approved April 21st, 1882, and the accumulation from the amount paid in by the Auditor under the provisions of the law to pay to public free schools the money set apart by the Constitution, as by act approved March 6th, 1882. The two sums amounting to \$139,166.25—less \$6,802.64, amount deducted on account of balances reported on hand in the several counties.
