

10. There is a great shortage in equipment and supplies:

- a. Work tables and sewing machines for the Home Economics Department.
- b. Typewriters, desks, and chairs.
- c. Hot water system for Home Economics Department and showers, etc.
- d. Gas line for science laboratory and cooking.

There are other unsatisfactory conditions that we might mention, but the above are sufficient to point out to you that Douglass High School is desperate in need of additional classrooms.

We are not over-looking the imperative needs for a gymnasium, and a cafeteria, but it is a case of emergency that more classrooms be built.

The committee suggests that a minimum of six rooms be added to the Douglass High School in the immediate future.

We hope that you will give us the necessary improvement in the very near future.
