

Domestic science room \$230, Library of 500 books with cabinets for same, maps \$50, cement walk from school building to pike \$140. A few years ago the community contributed \$250 for agricultural shop at Lincoln, \$30 for roadway. This year, 1926, the community has by private contribution given \$500 for domestic science cottage. The Grade school was also remodeled about 10 years ago with the cost paid by friends of the school. The shop and cottage are of great value in agricultural and domestic science work in connection with the school, but if the school were moved the cottage would not bring cost and the shop located as it is would be of little value. The school at Lincoln has been in successful operation 17 years and is running smoothly. Let us not move to a new location and new conditions which are very uncertain.

Some years ago Purcellville had some disastrous fires. You had the sincere sympathy of the Lincoln community and we have rejoiced to see you arise Phoenix-like to higher and better things. The Lincoln neighborhood has contributed in no small measure to the business success of Purcellville. We have had a disastrous fire and we feel that we should have your sympathy and help that we may again be able to have a school that will be a credit to us all. Our Lincoln folks have worked with you to make your Breeders Assn. and Fair a success and we are cooperating with you in other business enterprises in order to keep Loudoun County on the map. We have been doing these things willingly for the public good. When you in times past have sent out the Macedonian call, "Come over and help us" we have responded. We now send out that call and we cannot help but feel that you will reciprocate some past favors.

When L. H. S. was built, the citizens of Purcellville who were not Friends gave \$570. \$11,630 was contributed by friends, most
