Special Memorandum Melating to The Salaries of Colored Teachers

At its meeting on Movember 12 mb the School Board discussed at some length the adjustment of the salaries of colored teachers to the basis of a sinle salary schedule for white and colored teachers. With the approval of the school board the superintendent discussed the problem with the colored teachers at a recent meeting.

At its meeting on December 10th the school board had before it identical petitions aigned by the colored teachers, the County Wide Longue, the Loosburg P. T. A., and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People-Loudoun County French saking that the salaries of colored teachers be placed upon the same basis as these of white teachers.

At this meeting the school board slee had before it a copy of an opinion rendered by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, Fourth District growing out of a suit insituted in the City of Morfolk against the Morfolk City School Board by the colored teachers praying for seleries equal to those of white teachers and also an opinion of Attorney General Staples of Virginia. Both of these hold the opinion that there mean be no diffraction made

In the salaries of teachers on account of race or color.

Our school board can not make a binding agreement for any year until the appropriation for that year man shall have been made and its resolution serely cutlines a proposed plan of action because t can go no further now.
