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- - My own philosophy- -

Although Mr. Jefferson worked valiantly to have established a state-wide system of public education, it was not until 1870 that this became an accomplished fact.

Two or three years ago one Davis and others, parents of colored children in Prince Edward, sued the superintendent and school board of that county, demanding admission of their children to the white schools. The N. A. C. P. directed this suit.

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Federal judges in Richmond. I heard conclusive proof that the colored high school is better than the white high school.

Yet, on May 17, 1954 the U. S. Supreme Court said on appeal that segregation of the races in public schools is unconstitutional.

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One year and 14 days later, after considering the adoption of some plan for integration the court simply entered a decree that integration must be accomplished with "all deliberate speed."

There is confusion about the meaning of "deliberate speed." Your dictionary will tell you that deliberate is unhurried.

Illustrate with automobile speeds.

The time to integrate the races when the pupils and teachers can come together under conditions of cordiality and friendship and not hostility. We are not ready for integration in Loudoun County.

We have had hope -- we have plans for continued voluntary segregation in Loudoun County.

A joint meeting of the school board and Board of Supervisors will be held on January 23 to consider this plan.

We have had wide and favorable commendation of this procedure. We simply propose to correct the conditions in some of the colored schools as well as white.

But every vote against the convention to amend section 141 of our constitution will increase our difficulties in attempting voluntary segregation.

If you are for integration at an early date, vote against on January 9th. If you don't want early integration you would do well to think hard before casting a "no" vote.

The proposed amendment to section lill is the only positive, effective, and authoritative proposal from anyone to leave open the door of opportunity for education at public expense of those unwilling to attend integrated schools.

All literature from the N. A. A. C. P. and the colored teachers association opposes unanimously this proposed amendment. They think and know it would place a barrier in their way.

Headlong and precipitate integration would strike the most horrible blow at public education that could be struck.

Yet knowing that public integrated schools could not be operated in Prince Edward County

the N. A. A. C. P. and Davis and others went back into court and demanded action with reckless speed. That county seems now to have a year of grace.

Some seem to worry over lack of patriotism because we resist integration -- the supreme law of our land.

In 1948 this same court ruled that the School board of Champaign, Illinois could not continue religious education on borrowed or released time of the pupils. The Court said "Here not only are the state's tax supported public school buildings used for dissemination of religious doctrines. The State also affords sectarian groups an invaluable aid in that it helps to provide pupils for their religious classes through use of the compulsory school machinery."

Through the leadership of the ministers of the gospel and with the cooperation of the attorney general of Virginia, the state

Board of Education and local school boards we

still have religious education in our public schools, including Loudoun.

We thought the Supreme Court was wrong and there was no well-financed organized group to say otherwise.

The interests of both white and colored children can be served best when they are taught separately, as now.

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
