At a meeting of school bus drivers at Leesburg on October 26, 1944 it was revealed that many automobile drivers in Loudoun County are passing school busses while taking on or discharging passengers.

Section 2154, sub-section 108, of the Code of Virginia states that "Any person who shall fail to stop at a school bus while taking on or discharging school children, whether going in the same or in opposite direction and to remain stopped until all school children are clear of the highway shall be guilty of reckless driving.

This law has been in effect for sometime and has had much publicity.

School bus drivers have been instructed to report violators and prosecutions can be expected. The cooperation of the Sheriff and Trial Justice are assured.

I appeal to all motorists to help make the highways safe for our school children by 100 per cent obedience to this law.
