

From the Literary Loan Fund, the board approved when funds are available \$600,000 for a new Loudoun County high school.

From the same fund it released \$50,000 to Fluvanna County for an addition to S. C. Abrams High School and \$75,000 for Palmyra Elementary School.

It also released a loan of \$300,000 for a new school in Smyth, and \$48,000 for an addition to Woolwine Elementary School in Patrick County.

The board ratified a four-year building program for Goochland County and a supplementary program submitted by Nottoway County.

It also distributed \$46,000 of a \$50,000 General Assembly appropriation providing a discretionary fund to help localities who are short of school operating funds.

The counties receiving aid are: Appomattox \$3,500, Bland \$3,500, Brunswick \$4,000, Buckingham \$2,000, Caroline \$500, Cumberland \$3,000, Essex \$1,000, Fauquier \$1,500, Floyd \$2,000, Gloucester \$1,000, Grayson \$2,000, King George \$1,000, Mathews \$4,000, Mecklenburg \$3,000, Powhatan \$2,000, Prince Edward \$3,000, Richmond County \$2,500, Spotsylvania \$3,500, Stafford \$1,500 and Westmoreland \$1,500.
