


STATEMENT OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1. Indicate progress made in achieving the plans projected in the Preliminary Annual High School Report.
 1. Faculty meetings were had at regular intervals and study groups were set up for considering specific problems.
 2. P.T.A. set up a curriculum study program
 - (a) Public was helped toward an understanding of the school program
 - (b) Faculty was also made more conscious of the community's wishes in regard to the school program.
 3. Courses are being given locally under the auspices of George Washington University for adults particularly teachers in the community. It is hoped this program will be expanded.
 4. The University of Virginia is becoming interested in setting up an extension division in the area. All of which will facilitate the training of teachers.

2. Show progress made during the year in meeting accrediting standards, and report plans for meeting all standards.
 1. Carlos Short has completed a course which will qualify him for proper certification.
 2. Miss Katherine Bridges is properly certificated in library science.
 3. Mrs. Alice Stehle is properly certificated in library science.
 4. Theodore Caras is properly qualified to teach public speaking.
 5. James Racey is properly certificated in driver training.
 6. This leaves only four teachers.
 7. To reduce the teacher load for 1956 and 1957 an extra teacher is being added to the staff.
 8. Strong effort is being made to secure properly certificated teachers.




