My dear Mr. Emerick:

Dr. Howard has asked me to reply to your communication of recent date concerning teaching experience for members of the armed services.

The Regulations of the State Board of Education read in part as follows:

Full credit, within the limit of the \$500 provision in the Act will be allowed for all teaching experience:

- (1) In the State
- (2) Out of the State
- (3) Military service, if teaching experience was interrupted by such service.
- (4) Not more than 3 years military experience credit will be allowed if person has had no actual teaching experience but whose college preparation qualified him for a Collegiate Professional Certificate.

If the teaching experience was interrupted by military service, full credit may be allowed for such military service as teaching experience. If the individual graduated from college, entered military service and started teaching immediately upon separation from the service, not more than three years military experience may be allowed, provided, however, that the college preparation qualified him for a Collegiate Professional Certificate.

If, however, the person taught school, entered business and then entered the military service, or if the person after separation from the service accepted work other than teaching and then entered the teaching profession, such military experience cannot be counted.

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

Sometimes they have taught for six or seven or eight months and have no other fractional experience.

Peabody College made a complete survey of Dade County Schools and recommended that they increase their supervisory force in the near future. I am signing up to do substitute teaching in the county for the rest of this school term with my sights aimed at one of their supervisory positions in the near future.

Dade County has an excellent salary schedule based on both training and experience. But they do not take the applicant's word for the experience which is very understandable. It seems like digging a long way back into the dear dead past when I give you as reference but those years I spent in that little school at Paconian still stand out as four wonderful years. I always feel some envy when I know of people being in Florida in the winter. A trip I made for about a week to help out a sick relative this past summer didn't make me feel any wish to be on the Gulf coast in the summer.

I hope your wish to have a supervisory position in your county will materialize satisfactorily. We seem to change supervisors here about every four years. Our teacher turnover continues to be very rapid although the number who teach until retirement age seems to be increasing.

Our great big problem continues to be our effort to build a consolidated white high school. We are now planning the building and hope to let a contract in 1953. However, we are surrounded by a lot of hospitality and one slip on our part with some of the formalities could be fatal.


I do not know whether you remember me or not but I was principal of Round Hill High School, I think, during the session of 1927 - 28.
