

NEWS OR IS IT ?

The teacher shortage in Loudoun County appears now to be more acute than at any time for many years. Both the superintendent and director of instruction have made a diligent search at 32 colleges in many states in an effort to fill vacancies.

Last week two teachers resigned, one a physical education teacher because he discovered he couldn't care for his family and make financial ends meet with the salary being paid. The other found a position at a much better salary near where her husband works. She was scheduled to teach English and Public Speaking.

To help solve this problem we have already had a car load and large truck load of furniture from two supplying firms, Flowers School Equipment Co. and J.H. Pence Co., stored in the auditorium of the Leesburg School.
