



This is the tonette band made up from pupils in the upper grades. This band does two and three part playing with piano accompaniment.

Believing that music should be an integral part of any well rounded school program, the teachers at the Lincoln grade school under the leadership of Margaret G. Cockerill, set about to reach their goal of "satisfying musical experiences for every child in the school."

Several years ago they secured the services of Miss Elizabeth Chamblin, who now comes to the school one day each week for school music and one day for individual instruction. As the four teacher school is without

an auditorium, the work is organized as a unit in each room.

Instruction begins in the first and second grades by teaching tone matching, simple rhythm dances, song drills, song games and notes of the treble clef. This group has a rhythm band and use work books to complement their study.

In the third and fourth grades there is a more advanced rhythm band featuring zylophone, bells, triangles, drum, horns, jingle clogs, cymbales, tambourines and

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
