do so we turn to you for solutions.

- **October 16, 1934**
- We don't know if a Paeonian Springs colored school was ever built; but on October 16, 1934, the "colored" citizens of the hamlet told the School Board that they wanted a school for their children in lieu of sending the kids to Waterford, which was too far "to send the little ones and there is no transportation provided."
