- **1928.** On June 28, 1928, the parents and patrons of Hughesville School asked that their school be reopened, given that twenty or more children of school age wanted to attend. - An undated petition signed by 28 patrons to the School board appealed for an extra room for Bull Run, due to overcrowded conditions. <u>Bull Run Request for a Room</u>. Location: Colored Petitions, LCPS Archives.
- Jan 24 (unknown year) Another undated petition also asked for an extra room. In this case, the table of signatures also showed how children would be provided by each family. The parents offered to help pay for the new construction. Bull Run Unknown
