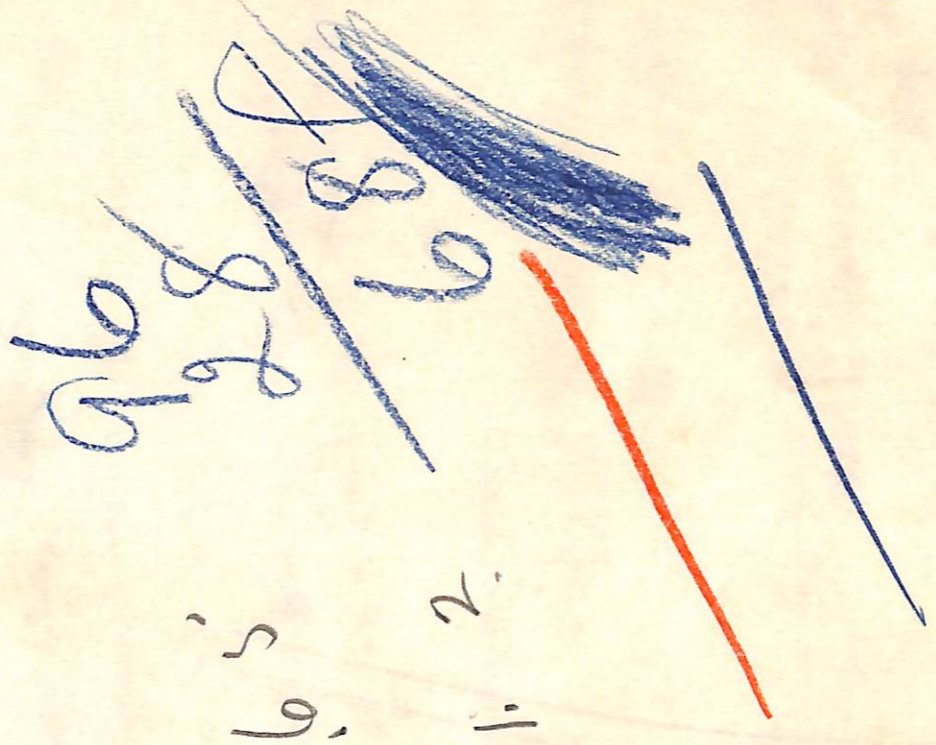

### Memorandum for Mr. McIntire

1. Lincoln High School was ~~destroyed~~ <sup>erected largely</sup> by private contributions in 1909.
2. A college and shop were later built.
3. Fire destroyed the <sup>main</sup> building on \_\_\_\_\_.
4. At a meeting of the County School Board on April 10, <sup>1926</sup> the vote of members was unanimous for re-building at Lincoln on the former <sup>site</sup>.
5. On April 26, <sup>1926</sup> an appeal from the above action was filed with the division superintendent of schools.
6. On April 26, <sup>1926</sup> the school trustee elected board received the appeal and decided as it had no jurisdiction. (See copy of minutes attached).
7. On April 27, <sup>1926</sup> the division superintendent dis. approved the Lincoln selection (see <sup>copy of</sup> letter attached).
8. Inclosed opinion of Mr. Bazile assistant to the attorney General of Virginia. ~~Confirms~~ <sup>is</sup> the latest development.
